Educational and Clinical supervision School (Policy) LEP (Rules)	An educational supervisor is allocated to each foundation doctor to maintain an overview of development and progress of the doctor within the training programme. The specific arrangements for allocating educational supervisors can vary but one ES per year is the preferred model. Foundation trainees are usually allocated a clinical supervisor for each post who will supervise the trainee in consultation with the Programme Director. An educational agreement will be completed at the initial interview of each post. Mid point reviews are required
	in each post. PAH: An Educational Supervisor is allocated to each Foundation Doctor for each year of their Foundation Programme to maintain an overview of development and progress of the doctor within the training programme. Foundation trainees are also allocated a Clinical Supervisor for each four month post who will supervise the trainee in consultation with the Educational Supervisor and Programme Director. An educational agreement will be completed at the initial interview of
	each post. Mid point reviews are optional in each post and are
	dependent on Trainee progress.
